We made an arch that has different colours to look through.



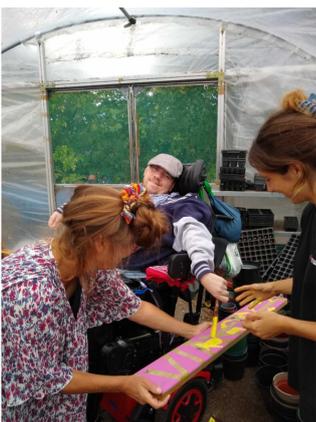
Beth made a 'bug trail', drawing pictures of ants, spiders, and more

We made flowers out of old plastic bottles.



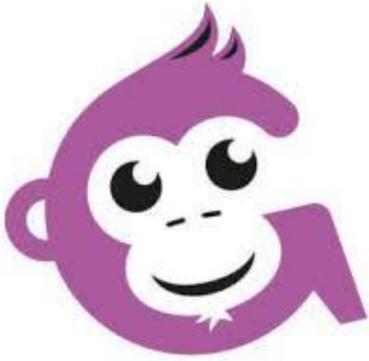
We made art out of hula hoops and recycled fabric.
