Steph says "Since...we made everyone welcome so many wonderful things have sparked off"

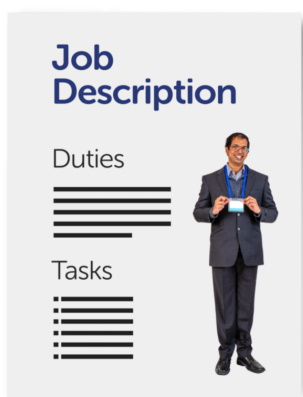




The cafe raised money for an accessible toilet. It has a quiet area. Many inclusive events happen there, like art classes and a choir.
